


### County Cup

# STC Committee - Abbreviated Minutes January 2018

### Minute / Action

### Update on Lights 1.2.3

8/1/18 Electric boxes have been installed. The laying of new cables was delayed because of the snow and holiday period. Cables to be laid in January and lights changed over to new LED system.

8/1/18 Half of the payment has been made the remainder on completion.

### **Court Maintenance**

8/1/18 Courts need to be protected from rabbits entering. The fencing company already working at the grounds will be asked if they can attach chicken wire to the bottom of the fencing to stop the rabbits getting in.

8/1/18 The Recreation Grounds are discussing flood prevention walls around the courts.

8/1/18 Court Maintenance contractor have suggested lifting the surface of court 4 and 5, clearing the sand and laying fresh sand in an effort to reduce the residue being left after heavy rain. It has been decided not to do this until proper flood prevention walls are in place incase there will be more flooding.

6/11/17 Request to install heaters in the table tennis room.

### **Team Report**

8/1/18 There are some changes to the NESLTA league rules which will be discussed at a meeting in February. Waiting for invite to meeting

#### Social

7/8/17 After a lengthy discussion it was decided to trial running the Sunday Social tennis in the afternoon because it was thought that an early morning start time could be a factor in the attendance. It was also decided to move the American Tournament to Sunday afternoon to maintain continuity of the social tennis time slot. Social Tennis would run from 2-4pm and the American would run on the first Sunday of the month 2-5pm.
